

STANDING RULES - Revised February 2020

A. MEETINGS

1. Regular meetings are to be held in a public facility, decided upon by the Board. Public facilities include any facility owned and operated by any state government or by any political subdivision thereof, as well as any facility owned by a church or corporation. Rental fees, when applicable, will be paid by the Society.

2. There will be five regular membership meetings each year. These meetings will be held in February, March, April, September, and October.

3. There will be one scheduled special membership meeting each year in May. This special meeting will be devoted to a "daylily auction" for members. There will be no routine business conducted and no attendance prizes awarded. Only a refreshment intermission will be scheduled.

4. Each of the six scheduled membership meetings will be held on the third Friday of the month, unless circumstances in any year make other dates more practical. Unscheduled special meetings, if any, will occur on the day most appropriate to such event.

5. Each of the six scheduled membership meetings will begin at 7:00 pm except the potluck and auction meetings that will start at 6:30 pm.

6. Because second-hand smoke is recognized as a substantial health risk, smoking is not permitted at any Society function which is held indoors. Smoking at outdoor events is also highly discouraged because of the close proximity of others and potential littering problems.

7. Effective the fiscal year 2015, the annual budget will be presented to the membership during the first membership meeting for approval by a majority vote. The Finance Committee will continue to modify the budget until approval of both parties is obtained. The Treasurer shall identify in the monthly meeting report to the membership, all payments not addressed by the budget or exceeding the budgeted amount for that line item.

B. HOSPITALITY

1. Refreshments, other than liquids, for all regular membership meetings—other than the entrée for the potluck dinner (which will be paid for by the club)—will be donated by member volunteers on a rotating basis. Anyone who has committed for a specific date will be responsible for finding a substitute donor in the event the obligation cannot be fulfilled by himself/herself.

2. Liquid (non-alcoholic) refreshments for all regular meetings—and the entrée for the potluck dinner—will be supplied by the Hospitality Committee and paid for by the Society.

C. ATTENDANCE PRIZES

1. Four attendance prizes will be awarded at each of the five regular membership meetings. There will be four winners at each meeting, each winner receiving a \$100 certificate.

2. Eligibility is limited to Society members who:

- a. Have paid dues for the current calendar year;
- and

- b. Have attended at least three regular membership meetings (*including* the current regular membership meeting); and
 - c. Have not won a drawing plant previously during the *current two year period*. A two-year period is defined as the period that begins on January 1st of odd dated years and ends on December 31st of even dated years. (Thus, a member can win only once every two calendar years.) The only exception to this rule would be if all eligible members in attendance at a meeting have previously won during the current 2-year period and there are prizes yet to be awarded; and
 - d. Do not have an outstanding plant won and purchased more than two years prior, which have not yet been returned to the club.
3. Each certificate may be used to purchase:
- a. One daylily cultivar of the winner's choosing, having a catalog value of at least \$75.00.
 - b. Cost (including shipping) will be reimbursed by the Society Treasurer, up to \$100, upon receipt of valid proof of purchase within one year of drawing date. Cost in excess of \$100, if any, to remain winner's liability.
 - c. Daylily cultivar to be of the winner's choosing. (That is, the Club does not dictate the selection.)
4. Each winner of an attendance prize will return a minimum of two fans of the plant to the Society when it has increased to the point that the bearer can retain 2 fans. If the winner is unable to return the plant

purchased then a plant of comparable value from the same registration year or newer should be returned.

5. Returned increases of past attendance prizes will be auctioned immediately upon their return. All members in good standing in attendance are eligible to bid without regard to any other eligibility requirements. (For example, a new member would be eligible, as would a member who just won an attendance prize.)

6. The Treasurer will be responsible for keeping track of and enforcing these rules.

D. REGION 11 NEWSLETTER

1. The Region 11 newsletter is automatically provided (free) to any AHS member who resides within Region 11.

Members of our Society who are *not* AHS members, but who want to subscribe to the Region 11 newsletter, can do so by paying the full 'Out-of-Region' fee directly to the Region 11 Vice-President.

The Society will subsidize the cost of an 'Out-of-Region' subscription for any Society member who resides outside Region 11, *if they are AHS members*. In this case, the Society will subsidize two-thirds of the cost of an out-of-region subscription. Such members wishing to purchase a Region 11 subscription will submit their one-third fee (\$5) to the Society Treasurer, who will in turn remit 100% of the fee (\$15) to Region 11. Thus the Society will be paying \$10 towards the cost of such subscription. (There will be no Society subsidy for non-AHS members.)

2. It is important that our Society Reporter receive the Region 11 newsletter to which they contribute. Therefore, if the Society Reporter is an AHS member but lives outside Region 11, his \$15 out-of-region newsletter subscription fee will be fully paid by the Society.

E. MEMBERSHIP DUES

1. Annual (calendar year) dues of \$5 per member will become payable at the October membership meeting for the upcoming calendar year. Members who have not paid their dues for the current year, by the end of the first membership meeting of the year, will cease to be an active member and will be dropped from the roster.

2. Lifetime Memberships are available for a one-time fee of \$60. Lifetime members who have not attended any club event over 2 years will be removed from the membership rolls and can be reinstated by attending an event.

F. REIMBURSEMENT OF PRESIDENTIAL EXPENSES

In recognition that the Society's President is encouraged to attend the annual Regional Meeting (implicit in duties), the Society will reimburse the President's actual expenses for the following:

1. The registration fee for the annual Regional Meeting.

2. The lodging for up to two nights, but at a daily charge not to exceed the advertised rate negotiated by the host society with the host hotel (plus tax). The authorization for reimbursement outlined in paragraph one is made retroactively, to officially recognize actual practice exercised prior to 1993.

G. MEETING NOTICES

At least two weeks prior to each meeting, the Secretary will mail or email a notice to each member address. The notice will include the date, the time, the meeting location, any major agenda items, and any relevant club news.

H. DEATH OF SOCIETY MEMBER

In the event of the death of any Society member, the Secretary and Treasurer will send a \$100 memorial donation in the member's name to the general fund of the AHS Region 11. In the event of the death of a Society member's close relative, the Secretary will mail a card of condolence to the Society member.

I. DATE OF ANNUAL SOCIETY MEMBER GARDEN TOUR

Each year, the Society will conduct a tour of selected members' gardens. The tour will be held on the last Saturday in June, with the following exceptions:

A. If the annual Region 11 Meeting is scheduled for the last Saturday in June, then the Society's member tour will be deferred until the first Saturday in July (even if the AHS National Convention is also scheduled for the first Saturday in July).

B. If the annual AHS National Convention is scheduled for the last Saturday in June, then the Society's member tour will be deferred until the first Saturday in July. However, if the annual Region 11 Meeting is scheduled for the first Saturday in July, then the Society's member tour will be held the last Saturday in June, despite the fact that it will conflict with the AHS National Convention.

C. In any year during which the Society is hosting a Region 11 Meeting or an AHS National Convention, there will be no members' garden tour.

J. OSCIE WHATLEY SEEDLING AWARD

As a memorial to Oscie Whatley, a well-known Region 11 hybridizer, Region 11 voted to create a new annual award for the best daylily seedling, to be awarded at each summer regional meeting. To honor Oscie, the last charter member of our Society, the Society voted to fund this regional award in perpetuity. This will require a committee, whose purpose will be to ensure that the award rules (separate from this document) are appropriately carried out.

K. MEMBER DAYLILY AUCTION

The plant budget for any fiscal (calendar) year is limited to the lesser of:

- A. The gross revenue from the prior year's member daylily auction, and
- B. \$7,000.

Oscie Whatley RULES - Revised Feb. 2019

1. For each summer Regional Meeting, the host club will establish an "Oscie Whatley Memorial Seedling Bed" in one of the host gardens in spring two years before the event. (The Greater St. Louis Daylily Society will provide an appropriate sign to be displayed in the garden to identify the bed during the Meeting.) The host club will be responsible for making sure that Region 11 notifies prospective entrants well in

advance where to send their entries {i.e. the name and shipping address of the host garden.}

Notification to Region 11 membership will be included in the first MoKanOk that is published after the host club provides the needed details. During the years preceding the meeting, the host garden will accept eligible entries and plant them in a fair and suitable manner such that each entry can be easily viewed during the day(s) his/her garden is on tour.

2. Each registered attendee of the regional meeting, AHS member or not, will have one vote to choose the seedling they believe to be best. Ballots to be collected at the end of the bus ride on the day each bus visits the host garden that maintains the Region 11 Seedling Bed.
3. Each plant entry will be identified in the Oscie Whatley Memorial Seedling Bed by only a number that is randomly assigned by the garden host and known only by the garden host until the voting is over.
4. To be eligible, at the time of the regional meeting a seedling must be unregistered and have been hybridized by a person who is a living member in good standing of at least one Region 11 daylily club. In addition, to restrict the contest to legitimate hybridizers, in order to be eligible, the submitting party must have registered at least one cultivar with the AHS prior to the year of any regional meeting in which he/she wishes to enter a seedling for this award.

5. Only one seedling can be entered by any hybridizer per annual Meeting. Up to five fans can be submitted.
6. A plant entry will be disqualified if the hybridizer or any member of the hybridizer's household reveals the identity of the hybridizer's entry to anyone outside the household. Of course the host garden owner(s) will know which hybridizer enters which seedling.
7. It will be preferred and become the ethical standard that any hybridizer who enters a seedling will not even reveal the fact to anyone, even if asked.
8. The vote of anyone revealing the hybridizer's name of any entry to anyone will be disqualified.
9. The vote of anyone who has been told the hybridizer's name of any entry by anyone will be disqualified.
10. Upon entry, each hybridizer contestant will prescribe whether or not his/her seedling can be used for pollen purposes while it is being gusted and will designate the plant's final disposition. If the hybridizer wants any portion of the clump returned after the event, he or she must pay shipping fees to the garden host. Under no circumstances may guest seedling plants be used as pod parents, even with its hybridizer's permission.
11. The winning entry must be registered with the AHS within one year.

12. The Greater St. Louis Daylily Society will provide a suitable trophy to the host club for their presentation to the winner.
13. The Greater St. Louis Daylily Society will pay the garden host \$150 as a stipend to reimburse him/her for the trouble and expense of maintaining the Region 11 seedling bed. The stipend is intended to cover the host garden's cost of bed preparation, plant labeling, plant care, etc. The value of the stipend will be reassessed every five years beginning in 2010 for a possible increase necessitated by the effects of inflation.
14. The person or persons hosting the Oscie Whatley seedling bed will not be allowed to participate in the competition. (spring 2019)
